

FCAT testing is approaching

The Florida Department of Education (FDOE) would like to inform you that your student will be taking the 3^{rd} , 4^{th} or 5^{th} grade FCAT 2.0 Reading/ Mathematics/ Science during the weeks of April ${\bf 15}^{\rm th}$ - ${\bf 26}^{\rm th}$. It is important for you and your student to understand the following policies before testing:

- Electronic Devices—If your student is found with ANY electronic devices during testing, his or her test will be invalidated, meaning it will not be scored. We encourage students to leave devices at home on the day of testing.
- Academic Honesty—Your student will be asked to sign a pledge prior to testing that says I agree that I will not give or receive unauthorized help during this test. I understand that giving or receiving such help during the test is cheating and will result in the invalidation of my test results. In addition, students are responsible for protecting their answers from being seen by others. If students are caught cheating during testing, their tests will be invalidated.
- Leaving Campus—If your student leaves campus before completing the test (for lunch, an appointment, or illness, etc.), he or she WILL NOT be allowed to complete the test. If your student does not feel well on the day of testing, it may be best for him or her to wait and be tested on a make-up day. Please also be mindful to not schedule appointments on testing days.

Please make sure your child gets a good night's sleep, a nutritious breakfast (which is free here at RCE for all students) and be on time! We thank you in advance for your help with this and assuring your child will excel!

CCSS Information Corner What is the goal of the CCSS?

The goal of the CCSS is to make sure that all students are well prepared for college, technical education, or the workplace after high school graduation.

Do the standards tell teachers how to teach?

No. The CCSS do not tell teachers how to teach: they simply outline the skills that all students should master. For example, the CCSS do not tell teachers which books should be taught in fourthgrade English/language arts, but they do say that each fourth grader should learn how to identify "a theme of a story, drama, or poem from details in the text" or "summarize the text."

Are there standards for science, social studies and other content areas?

No. At this time, the CCSS do not address content areas other than reading/language arts and mathematics; however, they do include standards related to content area reading in history/social studies, science, and technical subjects for Grades 6-12.

How will student progress in meeting the standards be measured?

As of now, it is not clear how students' progress toward meeting the standards will be measured or assessed; however, because the U.S. Constitution gives individual states the right to oversee education, participating states will likely be in charge of any testing that is done for the purpose of monitoring student progress.
